we decided to respond to this social, economic, public health and political crisis just as we intended to respond to other issues of gravity and concern with and through the arts




in august 2020, reFrame put out a call for submissions for an online exhibition of art centred around the politics and the lived experiences of the pandemic

thanks so much for making this. as a queer-disabled person, so much of my life has just gone into negotiating and trying to meet the world at an able-bodied standard which i held myself to. so i find that i am constantly questioning myself: 'why am i not functional enough?' 'why am i not sane enough for able-bodied dominated spaces?'
